

FREE TUITION

for community college

Mayor Walsh knows that college is too important to be limited to those who can afford it. That's why the City of Boston has committed to pay for up to three years of community college for eligible low-income students through its Tuition-Free Community College Plan.

AM I ELIGIBLE FOR THE PLAN?

To be eligible, you must:

- Graduate from a high school in Boston (BPS, private, or charter school) within the past 12 months
- Have a grade-point average of at least 2.0
- Be able to complete community college in 3 years
- Be eligible for a Pell Grant, as determined by the FAFSA
- Require no more than three developmental courses by the start of the semester
- Be accepted to Roxbury Community College, Bunker Hill Community College, or MassBay Community College
- Be a Boston resident
- Have low to moderate household income, per HUD guidelines

ARE NON-US CITIZENS ELIGIBLE?

Even if they cannot apply for the Pell Grant, certain categories of non-US citizens – including DACA and TPS – remain eligible to receive a small amount of financial support through the plan. Email TuitionFreeCollege@boston.gov to learn more.

WHICH COLLEGES ARE COVERED?

Bunker Hill Community College, MassBay Community College, and Roxbury Community College

WHAT COSTS DOES THE PLAN PAY FOR?

After the Pell Grant is applied, the Tuition-Free Community College Plan covers the remaining costs of tuition and mandatory fees. Students whose tuition and fees are already fully covered by the Pell Grant may be able to receive up to \$1,000 over three years for college-related expenses instead.* Check the application website below for updates.

to a four-year degree – tuition-free

Governor Charlie Baker and Mayor Martin Walsh are teaming up to make college more affordable than ever before for Boston students. The Boston Bridge, a collaboration between the city's Tuition-Free Community College Plan and the state's Commonwealth Commitment program, allows students to earn their **associate and bachelor's degrees, free of tuition and mandatory fees**. The Boston Bridge is a pilot program – meaning it may be a limited-time offer – so take advantage while you can!

- Opportunity to **earn BOTH associate and bachelor's degrees, free of tuition and mandatory fees**
- Money each semester to help with school-related expenses

HOW DO I BECOME ELIGIBLE?

- Meet Tuition-Free Community College Plan requirements
- Have < 15 community college credits to start
- Finish your associate degree in 2.5 years
- Finish your bachelor's degree in 2 years
- Attend school continuously, full-time
- Maintain a cumulative 3.0 GPA
- Commit to one of the many popular majors listed at www.bostonpublicschools.org/BostonBridge

HOW DO I APPLY?

1. Go to bostonpublicschools.org/tuition-free-college
2. Click on "How Do I Apply for the Tuition-Free Community College Plan?" button.
3. Click "Fill out the online application."
4. When prompted, check the box that says, "I am interested in Boston Bridge." A representative will contact you to guide you through the application process.
