- 2. Students must meet all application requirements, including official transcripts from all previously attended institutions. Student do not need to submit an application fee, essay or letters of recommendation.
- 3. Students must receive a 'C' or higher for a course to transfer. William James College will accept 60-90 transfer credits, which will apply toward Bachelor degree completion.
