Bunker Hill Community College Foundation Scholarships

Since 2014, proceeds from the annual BHCC Foundation galas have funded scholarships designed to cover financial need not met by federal or state grants or loans. We hoped that this additional aid would enable Foundation Scholars to take more courses than they otherwise would have been able to afford, in order to accelerate the completion of their degrees.



As you will read in the following pages, our hopes were realized and our goal was met. Sixty-seven academically strong students have received Foundation Scholarships, ranging in amount from \$2,500 to \$10,000. Twenty-one Scholars completed their tenure at BHCC in 2015. An additional 21 Scholars graduated in 2016. Twenty-one students are expected to graduate in 2017 or 2018. In fall 2016, 25 new Foundation Scholarships were awarded to students hoping to graduate in 2017 and 2018.

All of these Foundation Scholars have made an excellent start on their academic careers. Their futures are promising. We are happy to introduce them to you.

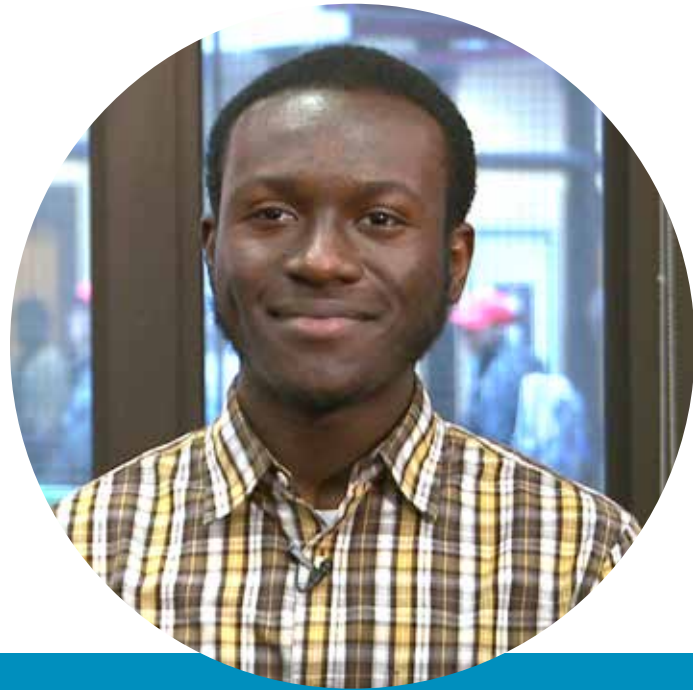
Kenneth Brown

Her Foundation Scholarship enabled her to become a full-time student. “The Scholarship covers everything I need after paying tuition and fees, especially textbooks, which I used to have to work two double shifts to afford!” said Kristina.

Her loss almost derailed her plans to attend any of the colleges to which she was accepted. Christa could only afford college by working full time and saving money. A severe illness brought about by her working conditions sidelined Christa. Last summer, she was homeless when a BHCC English professor came across her holding a sign that read, “I need a graphing calculator and a sandwich.” This summer was very different for Christa. She had a paid research internship at Harvard that even included room and board. “School is a constructive break from the harsh life I experienced outside of school,”

she said. “It helps me build up a defense against the adversity I may face in the future. One of my personal goals is to overcome my shyness and increase my confidence while I am at school. This scholarship is helping me do that.”
